Title of Workshop: Trauma-informed Care Certificate Program

Primary presenter: Dr. Jill Levenson, PhD, LCSW, Professor of Social Work, is a SAMHSA-trained internationally recognized expert in trauma-informed care. She has published over 100 articles about policies and clinical interventions designed to prevent sexual abuse, including projects funded by the National Institutes of Justice and the National Sexual Violence Resource Center. She has also been a practicing clinical social worker for nearly 30 years, using a scientist-practitioner model to inform her research and her work with survivors, offenders, and families impacted by sexual abuse. Dr. Levenson has been invited to present as a keynote speaker about trauma-informed care in clinical, correctional, and forensic settings in over 20 states, Canada, New Zealand, and Australia.

Overview/Description:

This 4-day training program prepares professional helpers to deliver trauma-informed services in a variety of settings with a range of problems and populations. Using SAMHSA's principles of TIC, participants will refine skills to conceptualize and respond to cases through the lens of trauma, translate TIC principles into practice, and create an agency culture that is safe, collaborative, empowering, and healing.

Lecture and discussion, Power point, handouts, panel presentation, small group, role play, case scenarios, video/audio, self- assessments.
