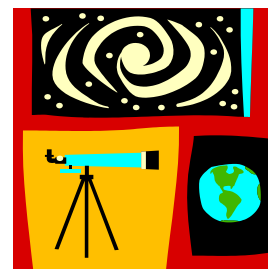

Currently we have been asked not to issue any more keys since there is no guarantee the lock will be the same once the lab is moved.

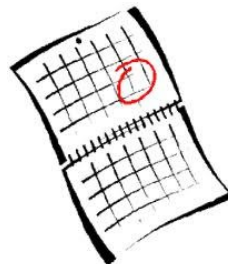
If you need access please contact HPSAB Chair Dianna Bellian or Historian Cheryl Frazier and we will do our best to let you in.

Meetings are from 4-5 p.m. in Lehman 328.



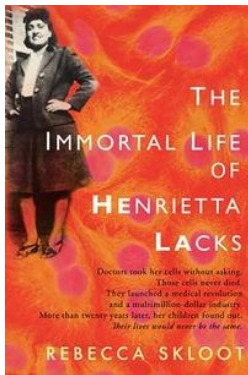
