Program Criteria

Peer Facilitator Requirements:

- Observe or co-facilitate at least one series before facilitating a program
- Participate in at least two monthly check-ins (90 mins)
- Read assigned literature in preparation for check-ins
- When doing facilitation, maintain open conversation with CHRSJ Project Director
- Coordinate and facilitate at least one TRACKS IGD with college or high school students

Opportunities for Students:

- Professional Development, including mindful self-compassion, expressive arts, facilitation skills, restorative justice circles, trauma-sensitive methods to facilitation, exploring biases, narrative and storytelling, among others.
- Mentorship and Community
- Paid stipend per series facilitated
- Networking with community organizations
- Research collaboration
- Professional recommendations
- Student fellowships to assist with workshops and conferences
