The psychology major requires the completion of 42 credits. The required courses include PSY 281, 283, 320, 325, 335, 382, 413, 436, 490, and a capstone course. The integrative experience requires successful completion of one of the following capstone courses: PSY 415, PSY 495, PSY 497. MAT 152, MAT 252, and ENG 410 are co-requisites for psychology majors. The student is permitted wide flexibility in the choice of the remaining five or more elective courses from the various sub-specialties of psychology. The minimum grade of C is required in all major courses. Psychology majors cannot have any more than 2 repeated courses in the major.

The psychology minor is 21 credits. It requires PSY 281, 283, 325, 413, and 9 elective credits within psychology. The minimum grade of C is required in all minor courses.

The Specialization in Industrial/Organizational Psychology (18 credits) is available for psychology majors. It requires substituting the following psychology courses for two of the five psychology electives: PSY 370 and PSY 423. In addition, the following courses are required: MGT 305 Organizational Behavior and Management, MGT352 Human Resources Management, MGT 355 Conflict and Negotiation, and MGT420 Leadership.

The Specialization in Forensic Psychology (18 credits) is available for psychology majors. It requires substituting the following psychology courses for three of the five psychology electives: PSY 307, PSY 313, and PSY 415. PSY 493 – Seminar: Great Cases in Law and Psychology substitutes for PSY 497 as the capstone course. In addition, SOC 320 is required as is one the

The Specialization in Forensic Psychology (18 credits) is available for psychology majors. PSY 415 – Seminar: Psychological Dimensions of Therapeutic Jurisprudence substitutes for PSY 497 as the capstone course. Complete a Barry University Undergraduate Application and submit an application fee. The application can be found at www.barry.edu. Submit official transcripts from all postsecondary institutions previously attended. The minimum cumulative GPA requirement for transfer applicants is 2.00 unless otherwise specified within the individual degree programs.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS TO THE MAJOR/PROGRAM OF STUDY:

Transfer student admission criteria for the BSW degree: College cum GPA 2.7 or above; no more than 5 W's, D's or F's combined. Evidence of volunteer or community engagement is helpful.

PROGRAM OF STUDY AT THE INDEPENDENT INSTITUTION

(Upper Level Course Requirements):
